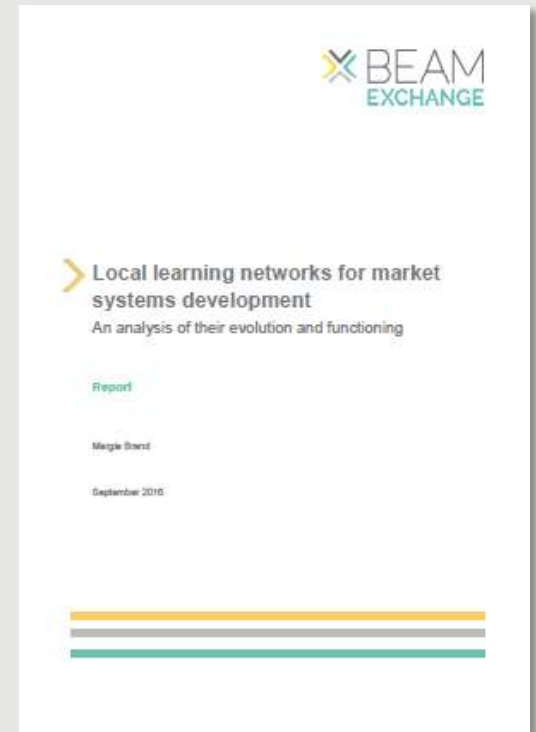

# Market Development Forum Bangladesh (MDF)

## Formation:

- Donor-mandated (DFID)
- Included in logframe of country project (Katalyst)
- Established 2005

## Operating Structure:

- Executive Committee (housed in office of Chair)
- Program Coordinator (1 x full time)
- Working Groups (Local econ. dev.)

## Member Profile:

- 25 member organizations
- Development orgs and Private sector only (Govt and Donors as guests)
- All applications accepted (focusing on orgs with market development projects or components)
- Tiered fee structure

## Registration:

- Formally registered

## Key Activities:

- Annual study tour to member projects
- Technical publications
- Training events

## Budget:

- In-kind support from members (including office space)
- Program Coordinator covered through member fees

# Market Development Forum Nepal (MDFN)

## Formation:

- Donor-mandated (DFID)
- Included in logframe of country project (SAMARTH)
- Established 2013

## Operating Structure:

- Executive Committee
- Program Manager / Convener (2 x part time from host project)
- Sub-Committees (considering)

## Member Profile:

- 20 member organizations
- Development orgs only (Private sector, Govt, Donors as guests)
- Not all applications accepted. Need to demonstrate good practice
- No membership fees

## Registration:

- No formal registration
- Operate under host organization

## Key Activities:

- Strategic discussions on sector-wide issues (e.g. as post disaster strategies)
- Technical publications
- Training events

## Budget:

- In-kind support from donor through host project (including office space and staff time)
- Members provide meeting spaces

# Kenya BDS Donor Coordination Group (BDCG)

## Formation:

- Development project initiated (USAID's Kenya BDS project)
- Established 2005

## Operating Structure:

- Executive Committee
- Secretariat (local member org) – 1 full time and several part time staff
- Working Groups (Training & Learning)

## Members:

- No formal members rather loose affiliation (approx. 10 orgs active, 75 orgs attend annual event)
- Development orgs, Private sector, Govt, Donors
- No technical scrutiny
- No membership fees

## Registration:

- No formal registration
- Operate under secretariat's organization

## Key Activities:

- Annual conference (approx. 100 – 200 participants)
- Annual pre-conference training (approx. 100 – 150 participants)

## Budget:

- Financially sustainable through registration fees for annual conference – fully cover Secretariat and general operating costs
- Donor funds initially. Still used to subsidize additional activities

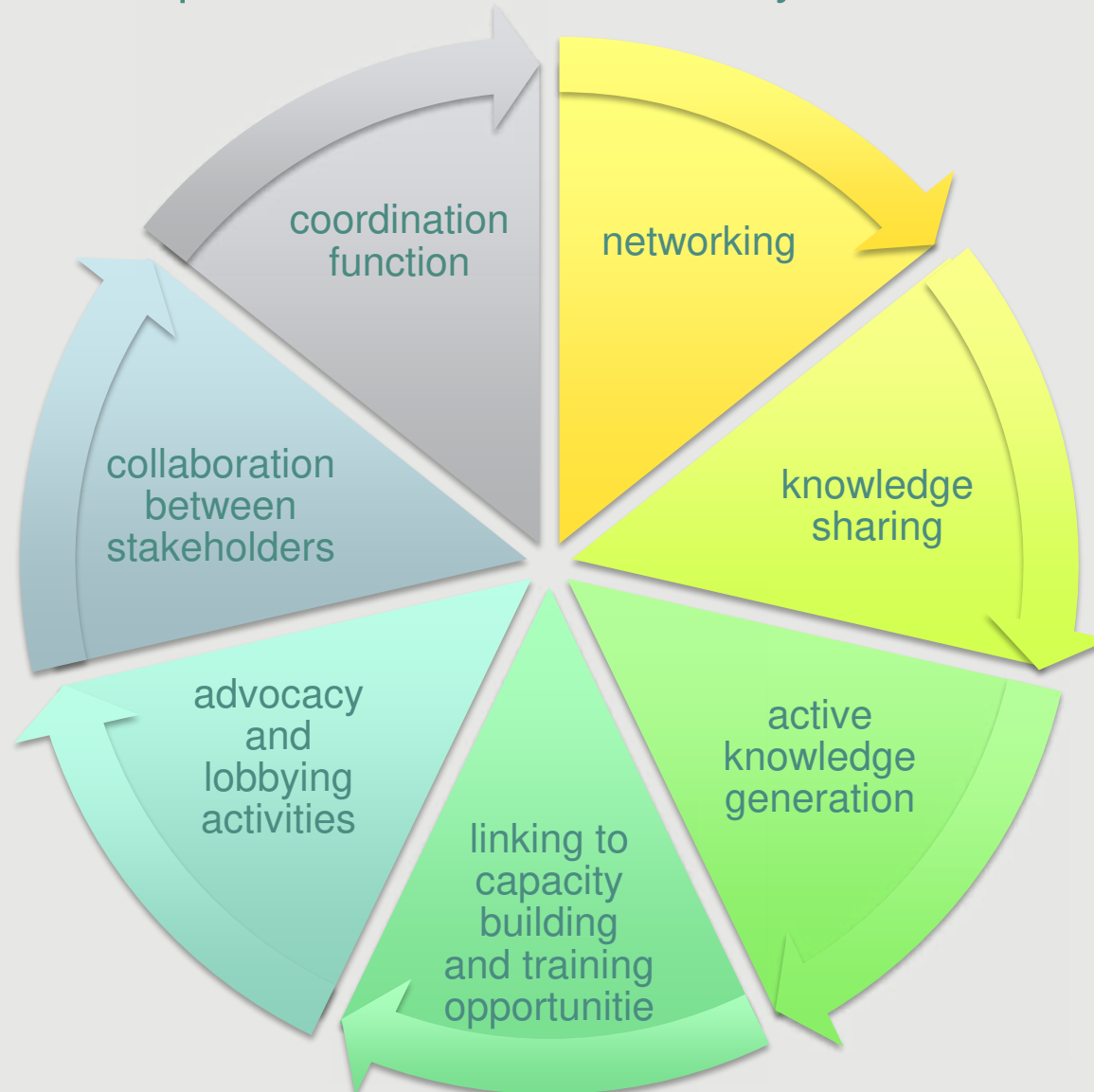

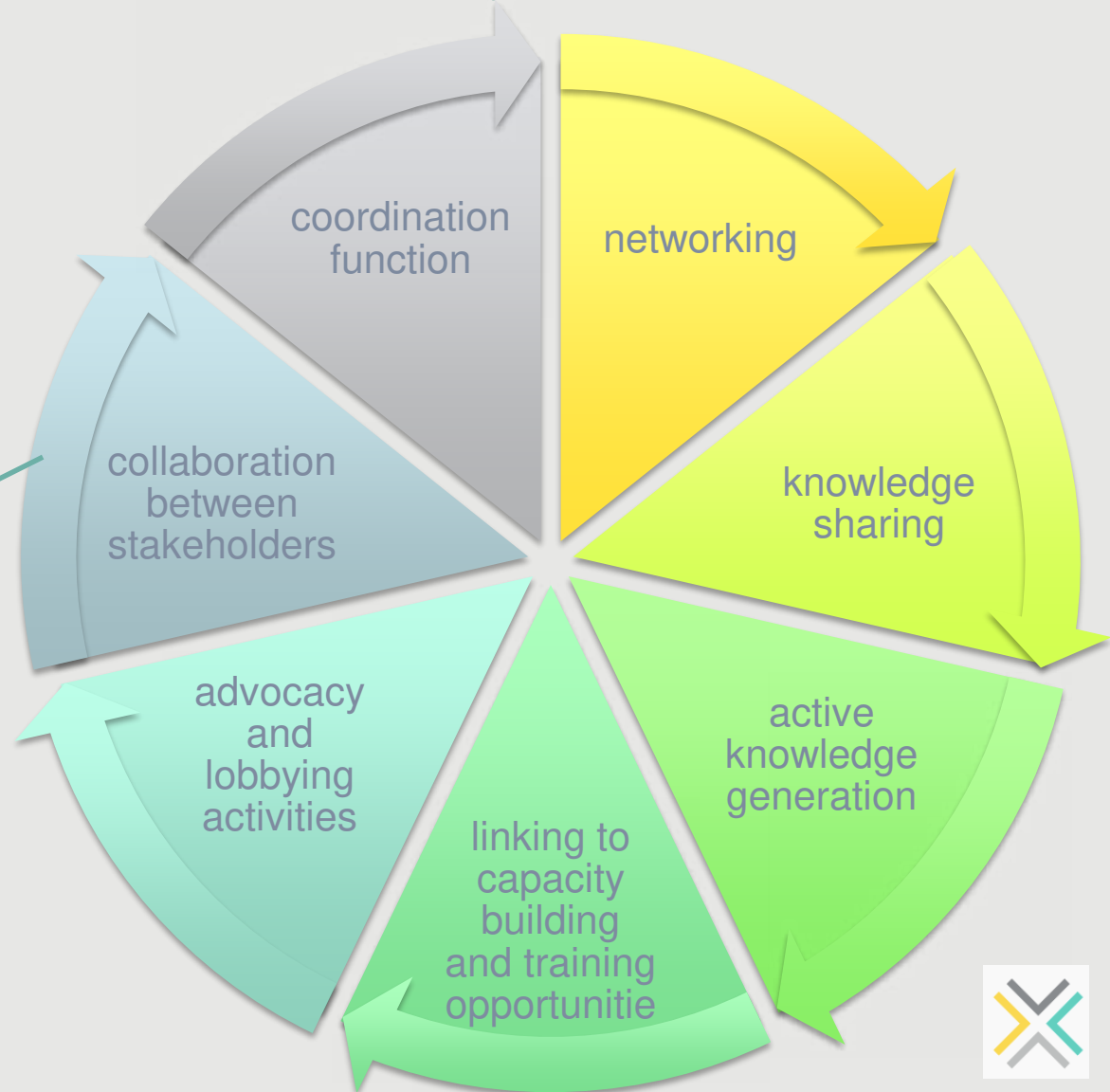

Networks appear to perform an increasingly complex set of functions as they mature



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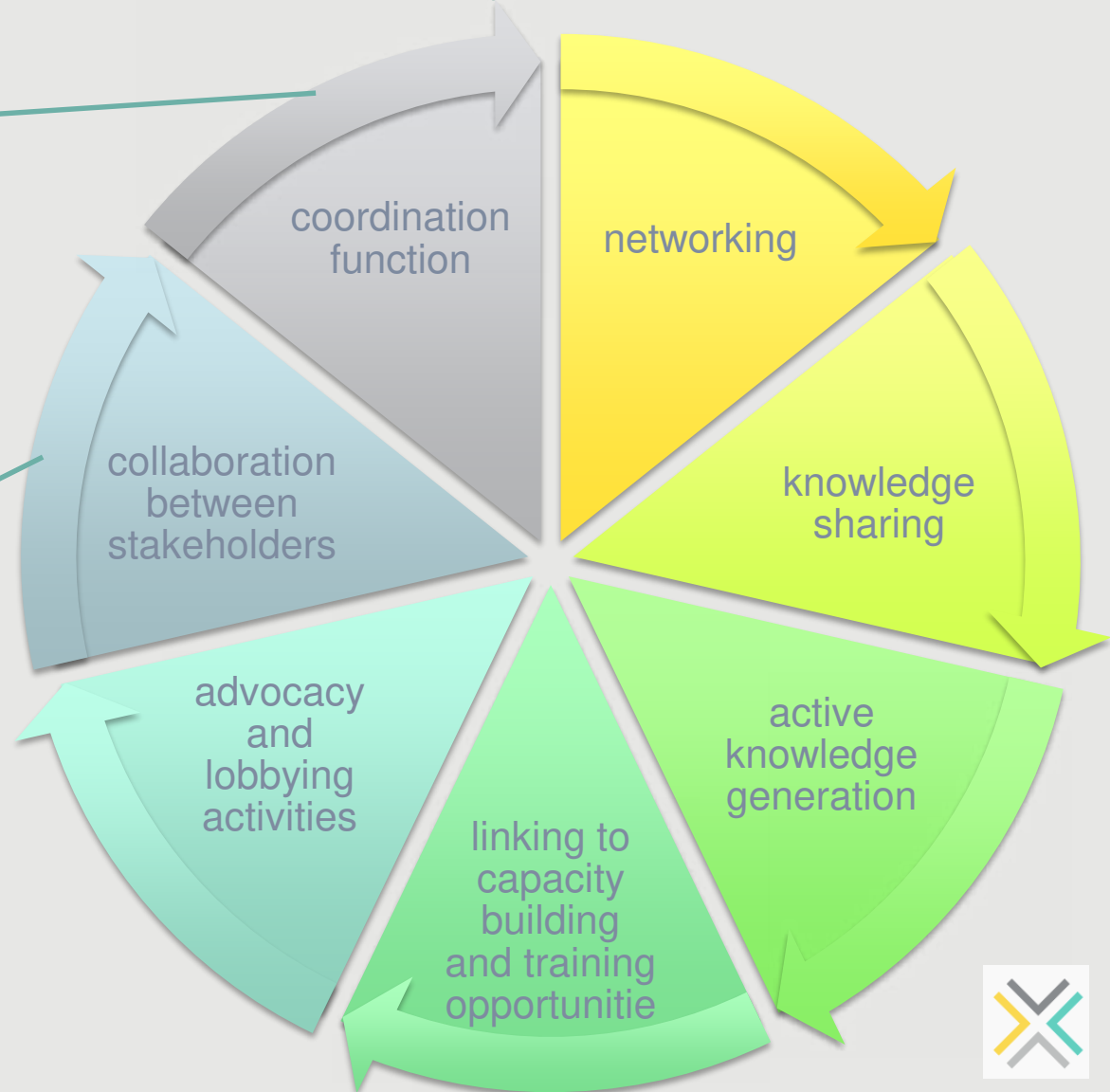
**COLLABORATION:** involves testing and tightening of concepts as they apply locally, or generating knowledge on cultural norms, perceptions, and social issues driving market behaviours



## Networks appear to perform an increasingly complex set of functions as they mature

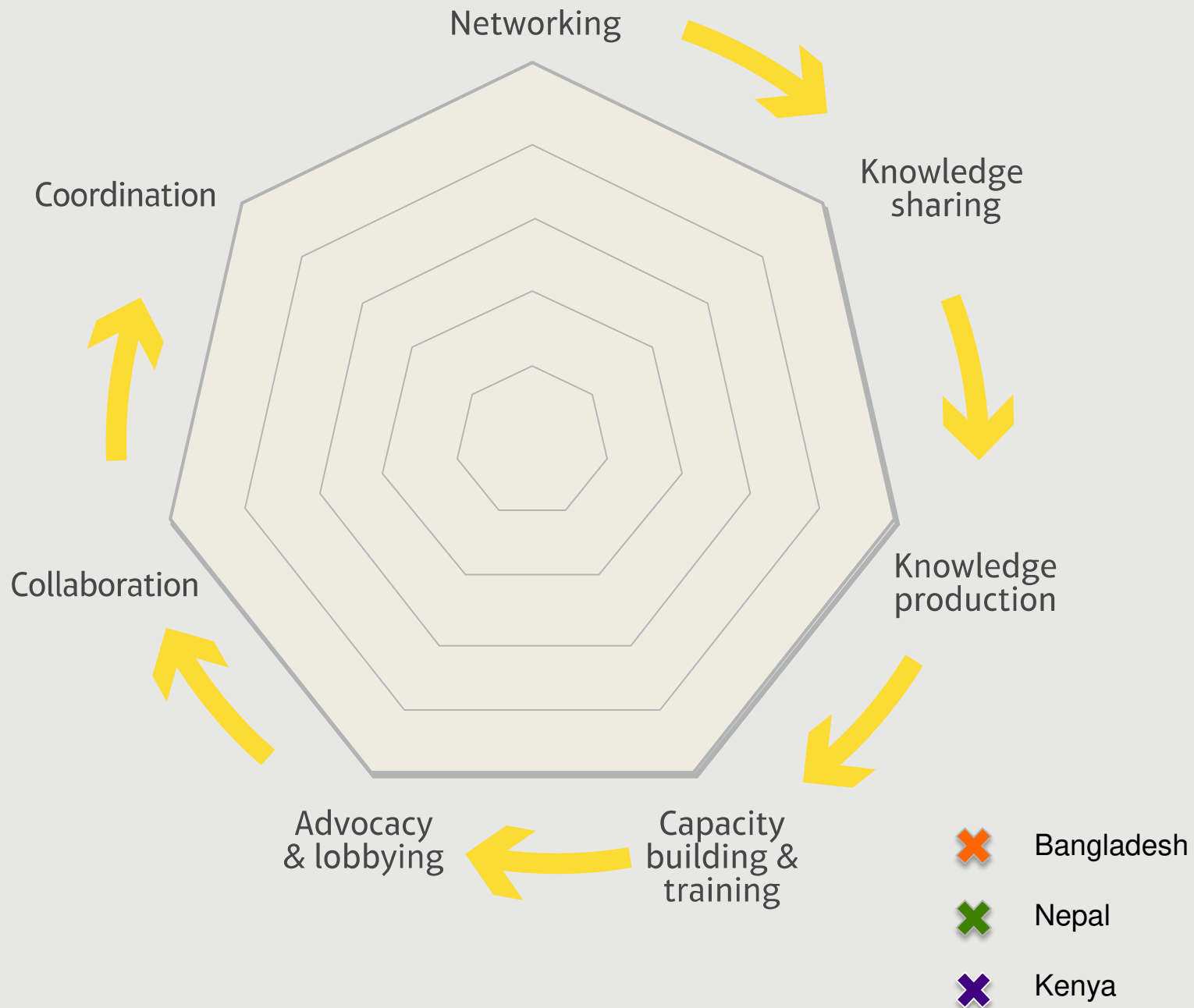
**COORDINATION:** between organisations' activities within market systems and even across sub-systems (such as health and education systems)

**COLLABORATION:** involves testing and tightening of concepts as they apply locally, or generating knowledge on cultural norms, perceptions, and social issues driving market behaviours



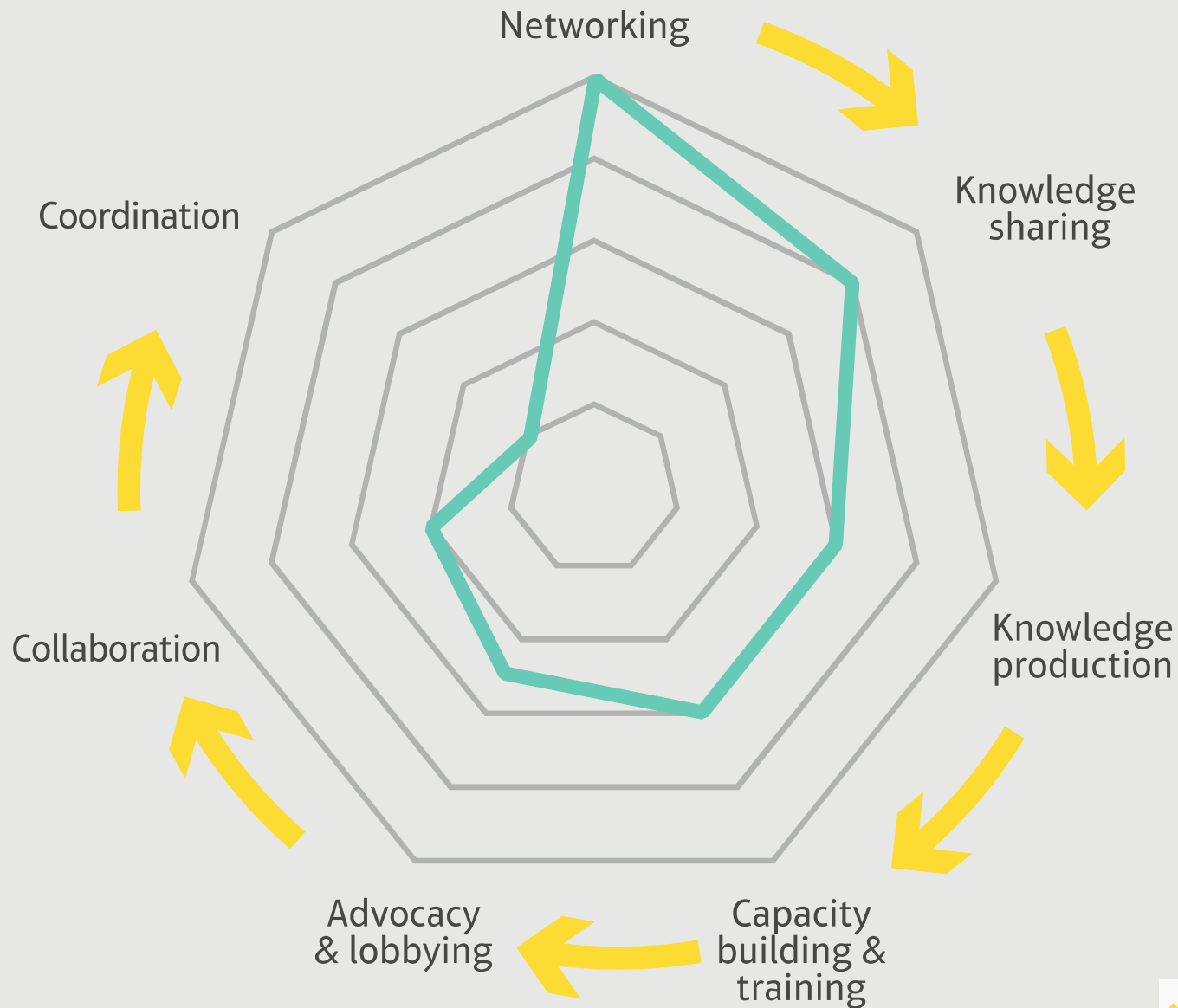
# NETWORK FUNCTIONAL AREAS

## RECOMMENDATIONS

### Supporting existing networks

- Encourage evolvement of network functions
- Incorporate local network participation into project results frameworks
- Assist in developing metrics that could be used by networks to assess and track their impact and value
- Reduce the culture of self-promotion and marketing and encourage honest and open dialogue


### Establishing new networks

- Advocate for setting up new networks in areas without networks
- Allow independent local network models to emerge

### Supporting broader system in which networks operate

- Align technical approaches
- Facilitate cross-learning between local networks
- Connect local networks with global and regional capacity building opportunities
- Encourage technical contributions from local networks into global technical deliberations
- Set up local donor networks
