

 How do Market-based Programming (MBP) and Market Systems Development (MSD) differ?


Challenges for Market Programmes working across the Nexus:

- Lack of familiarity with systemic approaches leading to an implicit preference for direct delivery
- Lack of awareness of the capacity of local actors
- Risk aversion/Do No Harm
- Lack of preparation
- Operational culture
